Section 2.4 Local Green Spaces & Community Facilities

Question 2:b

As a frequent visitor to my parents in Stroud, I have come to value highly the green spaces in this area. Open green spaces are very important to the wellbeing of everyone and vital to the many species of wildlife that inhabit them.

Therefore, I respectfully request that a District Wide Policy is put into the Local Plan going forward regarding the designation of Local Green Spaces.

One area I am particularly concerned about is the area known as Baxters' Fields, to the north of Summer Street, Stroud, which is constantly coming under threat from opportunistic developers. This area is iconic for its' beautiful landscape and its' literary connections to the late Laurie Lee and is popular not only with locals, but with tourists from far and wide.

I therefore urge you please to designate this area as, at least, Local Green Space. Ideally I believe it should be incorporated wholly into the AONB, rather than just being within the setting of the AONB, as the line between is totally indistinguishable. This area is believed to be the darkest valley in the district and forms an important ecological niche, with many protected species using it for foraging and roosting purposes. Most importantly there are Annex 2 European Protected Bat Species known to inhabit this area.
