Dear Sir or Madam

I am deeply concerned that, despite considerable objection from the local population and well informed ecological and conservation organisations, that Stroud District Council has now included site P29 (land off Ganzell Lane, Dursley) as part of the revised local plan.

I most strongly object to this land even being considered for development. Planning permission has already been refused for this land and all the reasons clearly stated in previous documents for refusal are still very valid.

As part of the 'Habitat Regulations Assessment' these precious meadows should never have been included in the 'Emerging Strategy Paper'.

Even though the choice and use of fields has varied slightly and encroach into the AONB, I fail to see why Bell Cornwall's weak and financially motivated promotion of the development of these fields has even been considered.

This site PS29 includes uncultivated meadows, ancient hedgerows and natural springs. Being close to the woodlands it provides wildlife corridors and a most diverse habitat for many fast disappearing native species. To concrete over this valuable site would in my opinion be an act of irresponsible vandalism.

I most strongly appeal to the council to act responsibly and remove this site from the proposed local plan.
