To whom it may concern:

I would like to raise my objections at the proposed 1500 housing plan of Wisloe Green.

I moved to Slimbridge in 2007, primarily due to looking for a village experience where we could bring our children up as an integrated part of a small, local, rural community. I am concerned that the proposed development will erode the sense of identity we have in Slimbridge as the village will become swallowed up into a huge suburb of Cam / Dursley.

The village experience will be eroded, as investment happens on the other side of the road and I have serious concerns this will be to the detriment of the village.

It will also put significant pressure on local services and access to those services.

The Ernest Cook Trust supposedly have a concern for rural communities - this appears to only be until the point when it suits them to make some cash.

I would like to understand with the volume of housing planned, the following:

How do the people making money from this, plan to support the surrounding areas that will be detrimented?

How do they plan to mitigate for extra services, doctors, pout of hours, dentists etc?

How do they plan to ensure the additional traffic pressure on local roads is managed?

1500 houses is a ridiculous amount to suddenly create in this area. This cannot be allowed to happen. As usual a small few will benefit, those selling the land and those building on it and all the locals will lose out, not to mention the new buyers who will be paying out for new properties which will no doubt have limited green space to support the wildlife that will be losing their habitat.

I am outraged at these plans and would be happy to provide any more input should it be useful.
